- Opportunity to acquire Microsurgery Diploma participating in a 3 month course
- Cadaver dissection courses in Paris

Next step


Forthcoming goal is to validate all the expertise I gather during residency after sitting the European Board Examination in Hand Surgery (FESSH).

Epilogue


