

Aim of the Fellowship:

Surgical reconstruction of spastic upper limb, wrist arthroscopy

Period of time:

october-november 2015

Description of the host institute

Created in1985 by Pr Tubiana, led since 1995 by Pr Gilbert in downtown Paris, Institut de la Main of Clinique Jouvenet is a prestigious European Hand Center, famous for it's prominent international teaching system. Appr. 7000 patients are operated annually following the referrals from all over France. All of the upper limb conditions are treated here, one of them is spasticity and tetraplegia with the leading consultant, Dr Caroline Leclercq (left). Plexus surgery (Pr Gilbert- right up), wrist arthroscopy (Pr Mathoulin - right down) are also the strengths of the clinique. There is even a dedicated shoulder team.







Experiences

I had the opportunity to take part the regular consultation sessions of Dr Leclercq, where I have seen all sort of but frequently complicated cases in hand surgery. Beyond the new patients it was very beneficial to follow up those who underwent surgery when I was personally present in the OT. Dr Leclercq, as a spastic upper limb expert regularly visits certain rehabilitation centers around Paris. It was a great chance for me to get acknowledged the well established pre- and postoperative evaluation system and professional physical examination tests of various spastic conditions. In spite of the usually tight timetable Dr Leclercq always took her time to give detailed answers to my questions and enlightened the obscure points for me.





I spent 6-8 sessions weekly in the OT. Since there are 13 upper limb surgeons at Clinique Jouvenet and 3-5 surgeries are performed simultaneously I could observe and assist great scope of hand and shoulder cases.


