FESSH TRAVEL AWARD 2018 Dr Caroline Leclercq July 2018 Mr Onur Berber Hand Fellow Pulvertaft Hand Unit England, UK



I had the pleasure of visiting Dr Caroline Leclercq and the team at the Institut de la Main in Paris. My primary aims were to gain experience in the management of the spastic upper limb and to observe wrist arthroscopy procedures with Professor Mathoulin.



I was able to explore Dr Leclercq's treatment philosophy for managing the spastic upper limb including the historical origins of her treatments.

The centre is also home to Professor Mathoulin who is a great proponent of wrist arthroscopy. He demonstrated several procedures including arthroscopic scaphoid non-union surgery.



I had the privilege to observe several spasticity procedures with Dr Leclercq including tendon lengthening, tendon transfers, intrinsic release and a posterior deltoid to triceps transfer for elbow extension.


I had the opportunity to visit a local paediatric neuro-rehabilitation centre on the out skirts of Paris. I was able to observe the multidisciplinary team approach to managing children with spasticity and in particular Dr Leclercq's assessment techniques. I observed the positive outcomes of selective neurectomy amongst other procedures.
